- Application for admission: February 1
- Major Scholarship (application and documents): February 7
- Submission of interim grades: April 10
- Submission of updated grades: May 15
- McGill Entrance Financial Aid application: 30 days from acceptance date

How your grades will be assessed:

1. Admission is based on McGill's calculation of your 'Top 6' pre-university (4U and 4M) course average and on the program prerequisites.
2. At least four of the 'Top 6', as well as all prerequisites, must be at the 4U level.
3. All grades are taken into consideration in determining admission, including those for failed or repeated courses.
4. Most applied courses are excluded from the 'Top 6' average; performing arts courses at the 4M level (maximum of two) will be eligible.
5. Grade 12 English must be included in the 'Top 6' calculation.
6. Admission is competitive and presentation of the minimum requirements does not guarantee acceptance.

Proof of English Proficiency:

You must demonstrate an adequate level of proficiency in English prior to admission to McGill, regardless of citizenship status or country of origin. Please review the specific requirements, exemptions, and accepted tests at www.mcgill.ca/applying/how-we-make-decisions/proof-english-proficiency

- Students who have lived and attended school, for at least four years, in a country where English is the acknowledged primary language do not need to submit additional proof of proficiency.

Documents:

Include your OUAC number on your McGill application so that they can receive your LIA grades directly from OUAC. If you have not applied to any Ontario Universities and do not have an OUAC number you must upload your LIA transcript to your file. www.mcgill.ca/applying/ive-applied-now-what/submit-your-supporting-documents.

Additional supporting documents (such as recommendation letters and personal statements) are not used for admission consideration and should **only** be submitted if required by one of the programs to which you are applying.
